Bachelor's Introduction Week 2020



Aarhus BSS is yet again hosting the largest Introduction Week in Denmark with the participation of more than 950 new students.

The Introduction Week takes place from 24 to 26 August and welcomes all new students from Economics and Business Administration (HA, BScB), Business Administration with supplementary subject (BA soc.), Supplementary Subject in Business Administration, Business Administration and Commercial Law (HA(jur.)) and top-up.

The week is designed to:

- introduce you to your new life as a student at Aarhus BSS.
- introduce you to your fellow students.
- diminish your uncertainties about starting your life as a student.
- prepare you for your first year at Aarhus BSS.
- give you an amazing and unforgettable week, both academically and socially.

During the Introduction Week, you will experience a wide range of academic and social activities. The programme during the day is free of charge.

Master's Introduction Week 2020



The programme will take place in week 35 from Wednesday 26 to Friday 28 August and will include a broad spectrum of activities that will give you a thorough introduction to your new life as a master's degree student.

Wednesday is mainly for the international students, who will get a thorough introduction to studying and living in Denmark and be offered help with practical issues such as acquiring a social security number and get introduced to our Buddy Programme. We strongly recommend that all international students participate on this day. If you are a new Danish student at Aarhus BSS, you can participate partly in the Wednesday afternoon programme. Here you will get an introduction to our IT platforms and a tour around campus.

Thursday and Friday are for ALL new master's degree students. You will:

• be introduced to your new master's degree programme.

- be introduced to the social environment.
- compete in the great Master Case Challenge, where you can win amazing prices by the associated company.
- experience this year's Secret Speaker.
- get to know your new fellow students by attending social activities, teambuilding and a lot of "hygge".

The programme is hosted by Aarhus BSS, and there will be activities during the day and in the evenings, so we highly recommend that you are prepared for a full-day programme and to attend all the activities. Alcohol policy during the Introduction Week

The commencement of studies is broadly understood as activities aimed at new students during the first half of the academic year. This period starts when the new students receive their letter/email of admission, and it includes the Introduction Week as well as an evaluation of the students' initial time at the university.

The following applies specifically to the introduction week at the AU campus:

- 1. Tutors are subject to the alcohol policy of Aarhus University, when they carry out work on behalf of the university.
- 2. Tutors or new students are not allowed to consume alcohol before and during academic activities that take place either at or outside the AU campus. This means that alcohol is prohibited between 8am and 4pm during introduction week. However, in connection with specific activities, the director of studies may allow for the consumption of alcohol.
- 3. The individual tutor group must ensure that during all activities there are tutors present who are not consuming alcohol.
- 4. There must be a reasonable balance between academic and social activities during introduction week. All new stu-

dents must feel welcome at all activities, whether or not they consume alcohol. Saying no to alcohol must never result in the new student having to refrain from participating in an activity.

- 5. The tutors are responsible for ensuring that all activities are conducted in a manner that does not require that the students consume alcohol.
- 6. The tutors are responsible for ensuring that new students are not exposed to activities which transcend their personal limits or seem offensive to them.

BLACKBOARD – AARHUS BSS' ONLINE LEARNING SYSTEM

Blackboard is a system for online learning and management of courses, which will give one common online focal point for lecturers and students. Among other things, the system gives you easy access to group work and sending and receiving messages. This is where your lecturer will inform you about changes to the timetable and upload teaching material. It is therefore important that you check Blackboard often.

- YOUR PERSONALISED PORTAL

The portal gathers all study-related systems and provides you with an overview of your teaching, announcements and events - and you only need to log in once. Simple, straightforward, and with a single login. You can access mitstudie.au.dk using your WAYF login. This is the same login you use to access e.g. Blackboard. On the portal, you will find a timetable that gives you an overview of your teaching in the current week. You can also page forward, if you want to see a different week. You can also find:

- Your three most recent messages in Blackboard.
- A list of the courses for which you are registered.
- · Your academic regulations and a clear.
- overview of your degree programme.
- News and events as well as direct links to information about e.g. exams, studying abroad and student counselling on your study portal.

You also gain direct access to your personal information on a range of different study administrative systems such as Student Self-Service (STADS), digital exams and your AU mail account. You can also access mitstudie.au.dk via a mobile phone or tablet. We recommend that you make the portal your starting page.

CONFIDENTIALITY

At the Student Counsellors' Office they have a duty of confidentiality. This means that everything you tell them will remain confidential. Their duty of confidentiality covers everyone i.e. your mum and dad, lecturers, instructors, the board of studies, the studies administration, the University Studies Office, social services, etc.

WHO ARE THE COUNSELLORS?

The Student Counsellor's Office consists of a team of student counsellors, who are also students on the degree programme in question. This means that they know exactly what it is like to be a student. The office also employs a permanent student counsellor, who you are always welcome to contact.

Student chaplains

Do you need someone to talk to in confidence? The student chaplains are always available for a personal talk, not limited to religious issues.

Life as a student may be hard or something can be difficult to handle by yourself.

You are always welcome to contact the student chaplains for a talk, regardless of the kind of crisis you have in your life.

It could be about relationships, grief, worries, stress, finding your path, loneliness, and religious and spiritual issues. You decide what you want to talk about during our session.

The student chaplain is bound to professional secrecy, which means that no records of our sessions will be made.

The counselling offered by the student chaplain is available to all students, regardless of religious beliefs, and it is free of charge.

The goal with the counselling is to help the student to see new ways of acting and thinking when life gets tough.

We can meet once or several times, if necessary. The duration of each counselling session is usually one hour. You can text, call or send an email to make an appointment. You may also contact the student chaplain by telephone outside normal working hours if you have an acute crisis in life.

We are two student chaplains in Aarhus who are employed by the Danish Lutheran State Church. Independent of the place of education, all students in Aarhus are very welcome for counselling. Having a Christian conviction is not a prerequisite.

Code of Conduct

The Code of Conduct for students at Aarhus BSS (School of Business and Social Sciences) aims to describe the school's core values and expectations to student behaviour when on campus and/or when representing Aarhus BSS and Aarhus University.

All students are expected to adhere to the values represented in this Code of Conduct.

The key objectives of Aarhus BSS are to deliver excellent research and teaching with academic freedom and open exchange of ideas and opinions which characterise a well-functioning and dynamic university environment.

LEARNING

The students are expected to contribute to creating a dynamic and inspiring academic environment and thus contribute to fostering a good learning process by demonstrating a high level of ambition and assuming co-responsibility for the teaching, learning, group assignments and projects. Aarhus BSS is committed to providing the necessary frameworks for this, for example through regular study environment surveys and dialogues with students.

In all learning situations, the school values a friendly and welcoming atmosphere between and among students and staff.

SOCIAL INTERACTION

A high quality of social interaction requires that students at Aarhus BSS exercise mutual care and responsibility in all professional relationships —when meeting with others in person, in group contexts and/or in the collective sphere.

Students are expected to behave in a friendly manner towards everyone they meet on university premises, regardless of race, gender, nationality, religion and social background, and to be considerate to the university's property in accordance with Aarhus University's disciplinary measures for students.

THE EXTERNAL ENVIRONMENT

Faculty, staff and students at Aarhus BSS work curiously and critically in an open and dynamic interaction with the external environment. When students act as representatives of Aarhus University and Aarhus BSS in their interactions with companies, organisations and partners, it is essential that they contribute to building and maintaining a positive reputation in the public eye.
